



4 Krimmler Waterfalls 76 km



With an elevation difference of 390 m, the Krimmler Waterfalls are the highest in Europe and a symbol for all the beauty spots of the Nationalpark Hohe Tauern. For more than 100 years the waterfall path has led to many viewing points and bridges, taking the enthusiasts of nature very closely to the nature spectacle.

5 Wildlife Park Aurach 26 km



A very special experience for adults and children is the Wildlife Park in Aurach, near Kitzbühel. In 1080 m above sea level you will find most local wildlife. During a walk through the largest wildlife park (about 40 ha) you can observe deer, lynx, ibex and wild pig.

6 Kufstein 23 km



Situated right at the border to Germany this historic town has developed to a popular destination for tourists. Kufstein's landmark, the medieval fortress, was first documented in 1205 and is home to the world's first and biggest open-air organ, the „Heldenorgel“ (Heroes' Organ).

7 Kitzbühel 22 km



Every winter Kitzbühel becomes a mecca for many ski enthusiasts. Guests from all over the world come to see the well known Hahnenkamm Race, one of the most treacherous and most famous of all the downhill races on the World Cup circuit. Each year at the end of July, the Men's Tennis Championship (Austrian Open) comes to town. This interesting mixture of Tyrolean tradition and the flair of a cosmopolitan city is well worth a visit.

8 Rattenberg 25 km



With only a population of 440, this medieval spot is the smallest town in Austria. It was first documented in 1254. Being one of the few cities with a well preserved medieval townscape, Rattenberg has a very special flair. In the 19th century several glassblowers settled down near the glazier's workshop in Kramsach which had a 300 years glassblowing tradition. Today the town is the centre of the Tyrolean glass blowers.

9 Tyrolean Farmhouse Museum – Kramsach 27 km



In the largest open-air museum in Tyrol you have the possibility to get a general idea of authentic Tyrolean farmsteads from different epochs. It shows how life of the Tyrolean farmers developed during the centuries. The aim of this special museum is to preserve architecture and rural life-style.

10 Silver mine – Schwaz 44 km



Centuries ago Schwaz was a rich town which acquired standing and greatness by mining silver and copper. Today you can visit the mine by way of the mine train and experience the harsh conditions of the past. The journey back in time is an unforgettable adventure for both, the young and the old. Also worth a visit is Tyrol's biggest Gothic Hall Church in the Old Town of Schwaz and the Planetarium.

11 SWAROVSKI Kristallwelten Wattens 55 km



Worth a visit are the Swarovski Crystal Worlds, created by the famous Austrian artist André Heller. They hold a unique mysterious world full of wonders and fantastical games around the crystal. The visitor enters the Swarovski Crystal World through the mouth of a giant and lives an incomparable experience of sounds, scents and lights.

12 Innsbruck 71 km



The busy capital of Tyrol is characterized by the impressive scenery of the mountain chain Karwendel. The picturesque Old Town (pedestrian precinct) holds, apart from many other sights, the medieval "Golden Roof". Also worth a visit is the Court Palace, in which's chapel you can see the "Black Men" bronze statues. For the ones who feel a thirst for knowledge Innsbruck offers a wide range of museums.

13 Großglockner 100 km



The best way to get an impression of Austria's highest mountain, the Großglockner (3.798 m), is on the Großglockner High Alpine Road. The road leads you from Zell am See to the viewing point Edelweißspitz (2.571 m). For the ones who want to experience the Großglockner on the calmer southern side, it is to be recommended to take the ascent from Heiligenblut via Salm-Hütte (2.638 m) or via Stüdl-Hütte (2.802 m).

14 Jakobskreuz im Pillerseetal 52 km



Kraftsuchende, Pilgerfreunde, Denksportler, Freigeister und Genießer – sie alle treffen sich im imposanten Jakobskreuz auf dem Gipfel der Buchensteinwand. Dem größten begehbaren Kreuz der Welt. Auf insgesamt fünf Aussichtsplattformen kann man sich einmal um die eigene Achse drehen und den 360°-Panoramablick auf sich wirken lassen.

15 Salzburg 97 km



Being Mozart's birth place, this town holds international reputation and still today Mozart's spirit seems to glide through the streets and lanes. Apart from the Residence, the House of Nature and the Castle Hellbrunn, Salzburg Cathedral is without doubt the main attraction in the Old Town.

16 Distillery ERBER

11 km



In Brixen im Thale, in the middle of the Kitzbühel Alps, you will find the Erber Distillery where schnapps distilling has a centuries-old tradition. In the oldest distillery in Tyrol, various high-quality brandies, schnapps, spirits and liqueurs are produced. Explore the history of the traditional distillery as well as the production steps for the entire Erber product range in the show distillery. In the modern shop you can purchase all Erber products as well as many other regional delicacies.

1 Hohe Salve – Hopfgarten



The 360° panoramic view from the summit of the Hohe Salve at 1,829 m - accessible from Hopfgarten with the 8-seater gondola lift, is a rewarding highlight of many well-signposted panoramic trails in the Wilder Kaiser-Brixental mountain and adventure world. The highlight par excellence is the Salvenerkirchelein, also known as the Johanneskapelle, the highest pilgrimage church in Austria, which can look back on more than 400 years of history. The rotating panorama terrace, with its 12 sundial stations and Salvi's Kraxl Platzl round off a perfect day of hiking on Rigi Tirol's.

2 Place of Pilgrimage – Mariastein



Set at 575 metres above sea level, 15 km north-west of the Hohe Salve, is one of the best known pilgrimage sites in the country: Mariastein, nestled in lush forests at the foot of the Inn Mountains. The pilgrimage church (built around 1360) is impressively situated on a 14 metre high cliff and has been a popular place of pilgrimage since the late Middle Ages. You can climb the 150 steps up the 42 metre high tower. In addition to the exhibits in the Schlossmuseum (castle museum), the coffered ceiling in the Fürstensaal hall, the sacred gold and silver objects, the pilgrimage boards, musical instruments and the Asylum Sword, the beautiful Mariastein pilgrimage church has two other very special gems: the "Tyrolean insignia" with the archducal crown and sceptre, donated by Archduke Maximilian, also known as Maximilian der Deutschmeister (around 1600).

3 Schlitters World of Candles

40 km



Explore the world of hand-made candles. In this unique wax museum hand-made and very valuable wax figures can be seen in their original size. The Crucifixion of Christ, Maria Theresa, Kaiser Franz Joseph, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs are a few of the famous motifs, which you can gaze in wonderment here. The demonstration event provides an insight into just how many different techniques are required to make a candle by hand.
